



FISD Bond Steering Committee Meeting 2 Notes

Meeting 1 recap and Q&A from Meeting 1.

Showed committee the FISD word cloud derived from the icebreaker activity in Meeting 1.

Determined consensus and discussed its definition, what it means to the committee, and voted on how the committee will make decisions moving forward.

- Supermajority won the vote and will be used to make all future decisions
- This means to pass anything, 2/3 of the committee members present must agree

Jason from Huckabee, who performed the facility assessment of FMS, went over what an assessment is, what it is used for, and key findings from the FMS Assessment:

- Many issues due to topography
- Many accessibility issues
- Issues with building envelope – cracks, joint sealants failing, brick damage, plaster cracking, window seals failing, single pane windows not energy code compliant
- Mechanical systems need updating
- Electrical systems not up to date with current needs and technology
- Plumbing systems not ADA compliant, hot water not available everywhere, not enough fixtures for number of students, fire sprinklers not available in all buildings
- Technology is not secure or temperature controlled and Campus Network Operations Center is located in a portable building – not a long term solution
- 28 of 54 classrooms are below Texas Education Agency's required size

Committee was lead on a tour of FMS by Sheryl Wallace, FMS Principal, to gain an educational perspective of the campus.

The tour took longer than anticipated, so comment cards were collected with two takeaways from each committee member. We will discuss these takeaways at meeting 3 on October 7th.
