### Minutes:

- Welcome
- Nominations and approval for John Willome to serve as Chair, Brandyn Quay as Co-Chair, and Dalen Kirchner as Secretary for the 2018-2019 SHAC.
- Approved May 16, 2018 minutes.
- Brandyn Quay read the responsibilities of SHAC.
- Officer Ayala talked briefly about *David's Law* and how FUSD has implementations in place to address cyberbullying.
- Dawn Barron reported that *AIM for Success* was being held at the Middle School campus again this year.
- Estella McMurrey presented on starting a student-lead club addressing student awareness and suicide prevention. (Officer Ayala and Mr. Gonzalez, FHS Principal are helping by finding a date for the first meeting and creating a venue to get the word out)—More discussion at next meeting.
- *Play It Safe* curriculum which teaches kids how to stay safe was presented by Dr. Styles. (More research on this topic is needed before making a decision on adopting the curriculum)
- John Willome talked about the need for a School Social Worker, Peer-to-Peer groups, and mentoring. Funding from the district was discussed. Other groups who can help are local youth ministers, Lunch Bunch, and Academic Boosters.
- Wanda Detmar was introduced. She is the District Outreach Liaison for FUSD. Mrs. Detmar reported on working with families and students in need, to help ensure student success.)
- Vaping concerns were discussed. Judy Mayo, FUSD R.N. mentioned bringing in an oncologist to talk about the dangers of Vaping. Mr. Willome followed up with the idea of having a pulmonologist also come speak. Blain Hahn also mentioned how drug use is becoming popular through vaping. It was decided a sub-committee will be used to help address vaping. The committee will consist of Judy Mayo, Ann Sanchez, Wanda Detmar, Patricia Rivera, and Dalen Kirchner. Mr. Kirchner will also discuss it in the safety committee meetings. Mr. Willome mentioned we need to find ways in the classrooms to communicate better about vaping.
- Dawn Elder from Starlite presented their program and how they help teens (ages 13-17) with substance abuse. Pamphlets were handed out.
- Judy Mayo presented Head Lice checks and Senate Bill 1566, TSO vouchers, Walking for exercise, and germ control around campuses.
